Historical Note

The Seal, Speakman, Talley, and Weston families are all connected to Kim-Eric Williams through his mother, Marjorie Elizabeth Talley Williams, and his father, Paul E. Williams.

Eleanor Campbell Seal Weston is the first cousin of Marjorie Elizabeth Talley Williams and the daughter of Martha "Patti" Campbell Talley Seal and Clarence Barnard Seal.

Ellis McClure was the uncle (by marriage) of Marjorie Elizabeth Talley Williams and was married to Lillian Speakman McClure.

Frank Marion Speakman (1882-1956) was the uncle of Marjorie Elizabeth Talley Williams. Educated in Chester County public schools, he then was a part of the University of Pennsylvania Wharton School Class of 1908. In 1910, he received a CPA and briefly taught insurance and business economics at Temple University. He went on to be a notable public accountant and actuary in West Chester, PA.

Speakman was the son of Edwin C. and Mary E. Fisher Speakman, the husband of Eva M. Fisher Speakman, and the brother of Lillian Speakman McClure, Clarence A. Speakman, and Mrs. Morton L. Talley, Sr. (Elizabeth Speakman Talley – mother of Marjorie Elizabeth Talley Williams). He was also possibly the owner of Willow Springs Farm in Thornton, PA.

Samuel Gill was the grandfather of Paul E. Williams and father of Erma M. Gill Williams. He was a selfemployed blacksmith and owned a blacksmith and wheelwright shop at Rapp's Corner in Chester Springs. He died at age 77 in 1931.
